

Data Protection Notice

One of your rights under EU law is that you must be informed when your personal data - also known as personal information - is processed (collected, used, stored) by any organisation. You also have the right to know the details and purpose of that processing.

On this page you will find information about the processing of your personal data if you are an attendee of the EDEN Conference Freedom and Security, The Hague, 22-23 November/ Event number 318DP110.

1. Personal data processed

As joint hosts of the conference, ERA and Europol may collect your personal data only to the extent necessary for organisational purposes, to provide you with information about the conference (before, during and after) and process your application to participate.

The following personal data will be collected and processed:

- contact details (title, first name, last name, city, country, e-mail, phone number, name of organisation);
- financial information such as payment card number or bank account, necessary to pay the fees of the conference or for possible refunds;

Providing this information is necessary for your registration and access to the conference premises.

Your consent is required for:

- photos, video recordings and web streaming related to the conference;
- invitations to future events we may organise.

2. Disclosure of data

Under certain conditions outlined in law, we may disclose your information to third parties, (such as the European Anti-Fraud Office, the Court of Auditors, European Data Protection Supervisor or law enforcement authorities) if it is necessary and proportionate for lawful, specific purposes.

We will never divulge your personal data for marketing purposes.

3. Social Media

We use social media to inform about and promote the conference through widely used and contemporary channels: Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn and YouTube . The use of social media does not in any way imply endorsement of their privacy policies. In the event that one or more social media are occasionally unavailable we accept no responsibility for lack of service due to their downtime. We recommend that users read the Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn and YouTube privacy policies. They explain each company's policy of data collection and processing, their use of data, users' rights and the ways in which users can protect their privacy when using these services.

4. Photos and videos

Europol may take photos and videos of the event and publish them on its website, EDEN, and other social media channels (Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn and YouTube). 5. Data subject rights

You have the right of access to the personal data we hold regarding you, and to rectify them, if necessary.
